

May Forums

May 5 Jim Mulvaney, FT, on Kara's Grief and End-of-Life Support

The mission of Kara's counseling services is to provide grief support for children, teens, families and adults who are grieving, as well as to those coping with a terminal illness (their own or another's). Since 1976, this Palo Alto nonprofit organization has been offering a safe and caring environment where those coping with death and dying can express their feelings of grief. Jim Mulvaney, Director of Training and Education for Kara, will describe the grief process, share insights into how to help someone who is grieving, and give us an overview of Kara's services.

May 12 Sudhanshu Jain on Climate Change Denial and Why We Need a Carbon Tax

After working as an engineer for 25 years, Sudhanshu "Suds" Jain decided that the impending climate crisis was far more important than designing the next switch chip for computer networking. In 2008, he retired from Broadcom Corporation to become a to become a "professional volunteer."

Jain is on the board at Acterra, and was in the pioneer class of their "Be The Change" leadership program; for the past three years, he has been doing free home energy audits with their "Green at Home" program. He has also installed solar panels on low income housing with Grid Alternatives, and been active with Citizen's Climate Lobby, which advocates for a carbon tax with 100% revenue recycling (dividends to consumers). Since 2011, he has been teaching "climate change science" to middle school students at Discovery Charter School in San Jose.

May 19 Cynthia Chin-Lee on Cohousing: A New Kind of Neighborhood

Cynthia Chin-Lee, associate member of the Mountain View Cohousing Community, will lead a panel on co-housing

communities near Palo Alto. A local children's book writer, who spoke to the Humanist Community last year about her children's book, Operation Marriage, Chin-Lee will pose questions to panelists Emily Rosen, PatZy Boomer, and Lee Daniel Erman.

Rosen is a certified massage therapist and enthusiastic member of Greenwave, a small cooperative community in East Palo Alto. She has lived at Greenwave for three years.

PatZy Boomer is in the Gerontology program at Foothill College and serves on the board of the California Council on Gerontology and Geriatrics. Boomer's determination to live "a different way" crystallized after seeing the devastating effect of social isolation her mother experienced when she stopped driving.

Lee Daniel Erman is a hospital-based massage therapist and former computer scientist. He and his wife have been involved in creating the Mountain View Cohousing Community since 2009, and are eagerly anticipating moving in at its completion in 2014.

May 26 Saeko Izuta on Hiking the John Muir Trail

Last July, Izuta hiked the 210-mile John Muir Trail, starting from Yosemite Valley and ending at the top of Mt. Whitney, the highest mountain in the continental United States. She took 25 days to hike the trail by herself, carrying a tent, sleeping bag, rain gear, warm clothing and enough food to keep her going. Along the way, she took about 180 photos, some of which she'll project on a screen during her talk.
