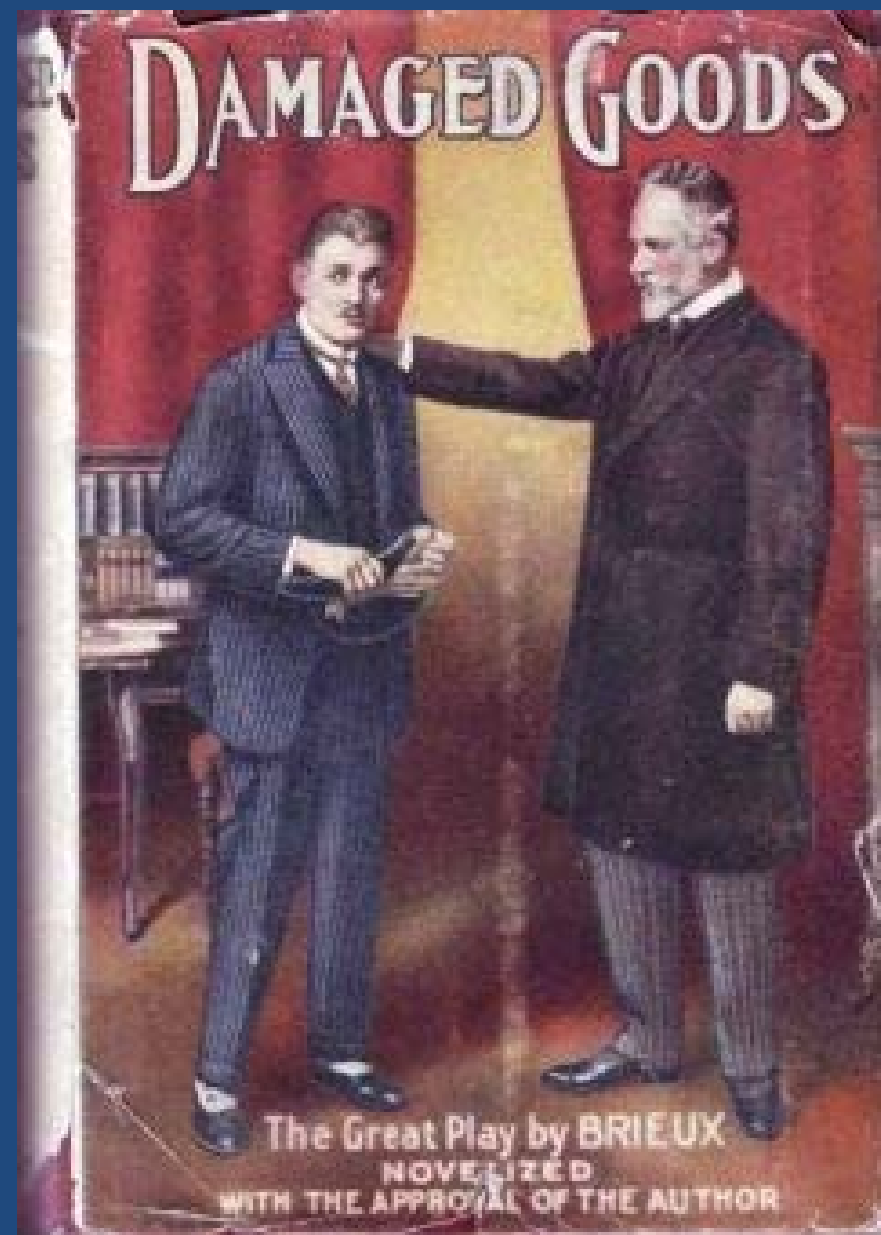

What the Report Was

Most complete study of the world's illegal traffic in women for immoral purposes ever made, original idea of report was to provide League of Nations with facts on white slavery so they could stamp out the evil.

Why It Wasn't Published

Representatives of some of the larger nations of the League were so horrified at parts their countries play in the enslavement of young girls, findings were kept from newspapers until some of the more sensational facts could be toned down.

What Good Did It Do

When findings of investigators were finally made public, some of the worst charges against several nations were left out, or stated with less pointedness, more tact. Facts about white slavery (presented through pictures on these pages) were revolting enough to make even those countries that were whitewashed by the League's report take serious steps in an effort to stamp out this inhuman trade in bodies—the most disgusting phase of modern civilization!

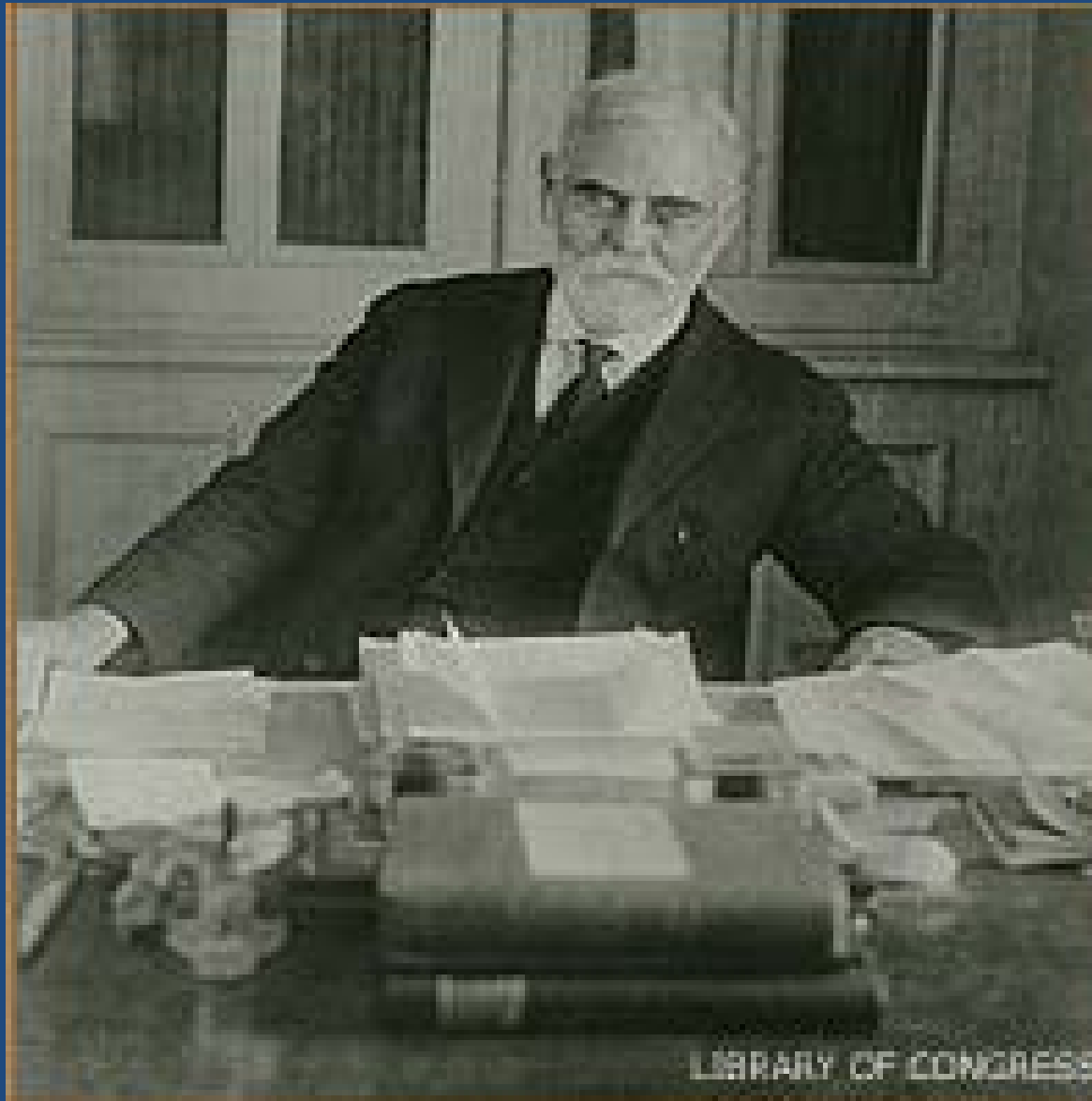
