February 2 Improve Your Argument's Impact

In this forum, Humanist Community member Laura Mappin will take a look at several scholars' views on this subject and then facilitate a group discussion on this topic. February 23 Happiness and Meaning in One

When bright individuals learn to overcome psychological blocks, creating happiness and meaning in their lives usually follows. In one simple lesson, Dr. Edelstein will show you how to achieve the former and offer useful principles for proceeding to the latter. REBT (Rational Emotive Behavior Therapy), devised by Dr. Albert Ellis, forms the basis by which these objectives can be met. REBT is based on the principle that disturbed emotions are caused by irrational beliefs. It teaches individuals how to change their thinking and change their lives. Dr. Michael R. Edelstein is a clinical psychologist with an in-person and phone/Skype therapy practice in San Francisco. He is the author of four books, including the award winning *Three Minute Therapy* (see www.threeMinuteTherapy.com).
