# April Forums

#### April 6 What is Occupy Now?

In September 2011, the Occupy Wall Street encampment captured the public's attention. Within months, however, it faded from the mainstream media, and many think the movement has died. In this presentation, Derek Tennant will discuss some of the ways the Occupy movement continues to bring change to our communities, including Strike Debt and Occupy Sandy. He will also lead the audience in an "Occupy Experience."

Derek Tennant is the former Facilitator of several General Assemblies held by Occupy San Jose in 2011 and 2012.

#### **April 13 Secular Activism**

The number of non-believers is increasing rapidly. Like all social movements, the laws that represent us lag behind our wishes. However, that is now set to change rapidly as well. Tom Manger will present an update about secular activism in California and nationwide.

#### April 20 The California DISCLOSE Act (S.B. 52)

Laurel McClure, a California Clean Money Campaign volunteer, will discuss the California DISCLOSE Act (S.B. 52), which would require political ads for local and state candidates, and state propositions, to identify very clearly the people, corporations, unions, and/or other organizations that contributed the most money for the political ad. S.B. 52 must be approved by a 2/3 majority in the State Assembly this summer (and then signed by Gov. Brown). Please come hear about this very important bill, and learn how you can help. #### April 27 The Bay Area linkAges TimeBank

The Innovation Center of the Palo Alto Medical Foundation (PAMF) offers a community-based program called linkAges to address the social and psychological factors that impact health and support aging in our community. A new component of the linkAges program is the Bay Area linkAges TimeBank a free, community-based service exchange network. LinkAges TimeBank members, including older adults and family caregivers, can use the TimeBank to meet daily needs, pursue interests, and get to know people in their communities.

In April of 2013 Fred Colgan of Institutional Stove Solutions (InStove) spoke at our Sunday Forum about a safe, easy to operate, portable cook stove high in fuel efficiency, and low in emissions that also sterilizes water and, with an available autoclave, can sterilize medical equipment. The stove is designed for use in refugee camps, schools, orphanages, and clinics in the developing world.
