March Forums

March 1: Meet HCSV's New Executive Director, Julie Wedge

Our new Executive Director, Julie Wedge, will discuss the upcoming projects that HCSV will be working on. We invite you to join the conversation to learn a little more about Julie and to discuss how, together, we will move this organization forward.

March 8: International Women's Day

A number of different presentations will be made in honor of International Women's Day. A speaker will describe the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom (WILPF). Dr. Cherrill Spencer, a retired SLAC engineer, will report on a conference she attended to advance women sciences and engineering. Ananthasubramaniam will report on her work with a women's shelter in Palo Alto and her current work helping poor women obtain credit. The Vice President of SEIU Local 250 will talk about organizing health care workers in San Mateo County to gain a living wage. Lois Flood will then dance in a tribute to the revolutionary modern dancer, Isadora Duncan.

March 15: Psychology and Political Framing

Humanist Community member and Board member Tom Bergstrom will present an overview of how conservatives and liberals think. This information is based on Professor George Lakoff's writing and videos. Learning how people frame their beliefs helps others learn how to speak to and work with those with different views. The goal of this Forum is to learn how to frame liberal views so liberals can work with conservatives.

March 22: Evolution, Adaptation and Bird Behavior - a Video Presentation

The basic evolutionary principle is elegant and even simple, but its application in human evolution is controversial to say the least. However, viewing bird behavior in video sequences allows us to analyze evolution in a fellow creature more objectively, and then to hypothesize its applicability to human evolution. Barry Boulton combines a passion for bird behavior and practical evolution using video as the primary medium.

March 29: ALEC - Buying Our State Legislative System on **Behalf of Corporate Interests**

ALEC (American Legislative Exchange Council) was founded in the 1970's as a secret entity based in Washington, D.C. with legislators and corporate members writing legislative bills for corporate interests in exchange for election campaign funding. Over 2,000 companies have joined, writing legislation to favor their business. In 2011, Common Cause helped shine a spotlight on ALEC and its activities, and with a coalition of organizations pressured companies to drop their memberships.

Elsa Schafer is a progressive activist (Democracy for America and Common Cause) who has fought for publicly funded elections, while working on healthcare reform in her day job.

The Women on the Cover

Bernadette Devlin McAliskey - 1947 - is a political activist. She was a member of the UK parliament from 1969 to 1974 and, at age 21, was the youngest person ever elected to Westminster. She formed and worked with various political groups during the Irish rebellion and was a leading spokesperson for the Irish Hunger Strike in 1980. She currently works with migrant workers in Northern Ireland.

Mary Robinson - 1944–1997 - Was the first female president of Ireland (1990–1997), and the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (1997–2002). She was "a transformative figure for Ireland."

Maude Gonne -1886–1953- an activist for Irish independence, peace, women's rights, and the relief of prisoners. A muse to the poet Yeats, she died at 86 years. Her son was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1974

Boudica - about 25–61- Celtic queen of the Icini tribe. A mother, wife, and warrior, she defended her country against the occupying Romans. Three principle cities were captured and a Roman legion decimated before the combined tribes were defeated.

Augusta Lady Gregory -1852–1932 - With William Butler Yeats and Edward Martyn, she founded the Irish Literary Theatre and the Abbey Theatre and was behind the Irish Literary Revival. She produced many books including stories from Irish mythology.

What Happened at the HC Board Elections?

On the February 1st election for the board of the Humanist Community, we had 8 candidates, and 5 openings resulting in a tie for the fifth slot. Two of the tying members dropped out to avoid causing anyone to lose and to avoid a runoff election.
