


Harrianne Mills

May Forums

May 3: Understanding Our World - The Human Mind

Neuroscience reveals that our conscious self, and our mind (which contains memories, knowledge, understanding, future possibilities, and more), are both part of our remarkable, complex, human brain. Please join us as we explore three exhibits at the San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles.

"A Common Thread" brings together the artwork of seventeen contemporary artists from across the United States who examine and sometimes subvert the centuries-old tradition of needlework.

"Kawandi Adventure: Quilts by Margaret Fabrizio" is inspired by a 2011 exhibition of kawandi at the Museum of the African Diaspora in San Francisco, Fabrizio was compelled to learn more about the Siddi women of Karnataka, India, who had created the dazzlingly colorful quilts (kawandi). Fabrizio created twenty kawandi style quilts from scraps and recycled clothing.
