

Humanists believe in democracy. We believe that all people should be equal under the law, that they can express themselves freely and honestly on any subject, that they can live their lives as they see fit, and that their government should protect the environment and honor the commitments to its citizens.

We are uncomfortable with what is happening. Noncitizens are rounded up and deported to foreign prisons with no legal access, visitors visas are revoked for engaging in legal demonstrations. Environmental protection laws, science funding, life saving USAID, and health care either reduced of stopped completely. Christian Nationalists have a growing influence on the regime.

But there is hope. There is growing concern about what's happening and more individuals, organizations, and governing bodies are bringing suits against this administration. The American Humanist Association is a part of this resistance.

Most Americans see it as a moral failing to just stand by while others are denied their civil and human rights. We also oppose pseudoscience, whether it is religiously-motivated or from a secular source. Superstition should never be an excuse for forcing religious beliefs on the public.

The AHA works to defeat laws that harm the separation of church and state. We litigate and participate in other legal advocacy through the AHA's legal organization, the Appignani Humanist Legal Center; and we mobilize members to speak out against governmental religious favoritism.

Religion, tradition, and culture can no longer be excuses for systemic oppression.


